

- 1 All exhibitors must sign an Agricultural Societies of NSW Inc. Indemnity & Waiver Form.
- 2 The classes in the Horse Section of this Schedule will be conducted under the competition rules of the Equestrian Federation of Australia (NSW) Ltd (Inc. in NSW Hack Council of Australasia.
- 3 **Camping Fees** \$12.00 per night per standard site (single passenger vehicle plus horse float) plus \$10 extra for electricity. Application forms are available from the Secretary.
- 4 **Stalls** need to be booked. Application forms are available from the Secretary and need to be accompanied with payment of \$10.00 per horse. Small/miniature horses may require additional ropes or panels to contain them in the stalls.
- 5 **Local Classes** are restricted to residents living within a 40 km radius of the Wellington Showground or Active Members of the Wellington Pony Club. Local horses or ponies must be the property of the exhibitor 30 days before the show.
- 6 Stallions are only eligible to compete in classes stipulated. All stallions to be shown on a bit or chain & must be handled by a person over the age of 17 years.
- 7 Winners of Perpetual Trophies shall be directly responsible for their safe return at least **two months** before the Show.
- 8 Protest against an award must be lodged in writing with the Stewards of the Section or at the Secretary's Office within half an hour of the award being made and must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 (which is forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous)
- 9 It is recommended ASA approved helmets be worn.
- 10 Registration papers for Breed/Coloured classes must be presented to Stewards on entering the ring.
- 11 **Improper Behaviour.** Outside assistance to competitors by word, be it radio or any other method in the Horse Ring Events will NOT be permitted. If in breach of this ruling, competitors and their exhibits may be dismissed from the event and from the Showground. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC disputes and disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee.
- 12 Drug testing may be carried out at this Show. Any competitor, exhibitor, owner, found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary Rules will be investigated by the Disputes and Disciplinary Committee and dealt with accordingly.
- 13 Misconduct on the part of any competitor may result in the refusal of future entries.
- 14 Chief Stewards reserve the right to change, delete, vary or abandon any part of the Ring program.
- 15 In classes where age is a condition of entry, a Birth Certificate must be produced on request.
- 16 Members of the EFA, Hack Council, Australian Driving Society and Australian Stock Horse Society must produce proof of membership upon entering any event listed, if requested to do so.
- 17 No person will be allowed to enter the ring, with the exception of Stewards, Judges or Show Officials, while a competition is in progress.
- 18 PIC numbers must be written on Waiver Forms for RAS. This is a stipulation of the ASC Horse Committee.

Horse Section (continued)

- 19 **Definition of a Novice** - Horse or Rider who has not won a 1st place at any Agricultural Show in an individual (Open Ridden Hack or Rider) class at any Official Show. This Novice definition also applies to Show Hunters in the relevant competition.
 - 20 **Definition of an Intermediate Hack** - Horse that has not been placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in an individual ridden hack class at any Royal Show and including RNA, Bathurst, Toowoomba, Launceston and Geelong Royals. This intermediate definition also applies to Show Hunters in the relevant competition.
 - 21 Golden Oldies classes are for riders over 50 years of age and excludes Professional Competitors.

RECIPE

Here's what you need:

- 250g (8 oz) sultanas
- 250g (8 oz) chopped raisins
- 250g (8 oz) currants
- 125g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
- 90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries
- 90g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g (8 oz) plain flour
- 60g (2 oz) self raising flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g (8 oz) butter
- 250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence **OR** finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

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Camping

Camping: Basic camping facilities are available at the showgrounds for exhibitors. Camping fees are \$12.00 per night per standard site (single passenger vehicle plus horse float : larger sites available on application) plus \$10 extra for electricity if required. Application forms are available from the Secretary prior to show day and from the Showground Office on show days. Application must be filled out prior to entering exhibits. Failure to pay camping fees may result in the Wellington Show Society withholding ribbons and prizes owing to successful exhibitors until outstanding fees are paid.

Horse Stalls

Horse Stalls need to be booked. Application forms are available from the Secretary and need to be accompanied with payment of \$10.00 per horse. Small/miniature horses may require additional ropes or panels to contain them within the stalls.

Regulations for Trade Space

- 1 Applications for space shall be made by contacting the Show Society. We will forward you the required forms. These forms are to be completed and returned with a copy of your insurance policy and deposit/full payment.
- 2 Full payment or balance must be paid prior to set-up at showground.
- 3 The charge for ground space will be \$15.00 per metre based on the longest frontage of the site.
- 4 Maximum number of Exhibitor passes issued will be two.
- 5 Exhibitor's passes are not transferable.
- 6 Ground space shall be made available at the discretion of the Committee to any person, firm or agent of the representative for the display of machinery, motor vehicles, general goods, clothing, furniture, general display purposes, jewellery.
- 7 Note that for safety reasons there is no vehicular access to the market stall / trade space sites between 9.00am and 7.00pm on show day without prior arrangement with and direct supervision by the Trade Space Coordinator or Show Secretary.

General Regulations

- 1 All entries, except those for the ring, are to be made and lodged at the Show Office or Pavilions on advertised dates.
- 2 Exhibitors will not be allowed to attach to their exhibits any prize tickets or ribbons other than those awarded at the current show.
- 3 Wellington Show Society will take care of the exhibits sent to its show but will not accept any responsibility for damage done to it or them either by fire, theft or by any other cause whatsoever and will only receive entries from Exhibitors subject to these rules.
- 4 Exhibitors please note any special regulations at the beginning of each section.
- 5 Wellington Show Society reserves the right to refuse entry to the Show or to evict any person from the Show, at any time on such grounds as may be determined by the Committee.
- 6 Wellington Show Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit and will not under any circumstance hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of livestock or exhibits of any kind or any damage done thereto, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor will complete an AgShows NSW Participants Indemnity & Waiver Form against any legal proceedings arising from such accident, loss or damage.
- 7 In the event of there being only one exhibit in any class, the awarding of the prize will be left to the discretion of the Judge.
- 8 No pavilion exhibit may be removed before 7.00pm on Show Day.
- 9 Owners of animals exhibiting in local classes must reside within a 40 km radius of the Wellington Showground.

Stewards

- 1 Each Steward must be in attendance at the Showground at the appointed time to receive exhibits.
- 2 Stewards are responsible for seeing that the exhibits are properly classed to enter and all exhibits in such a class are placed together for judging.
- 3 Stewards will remove exhibitors and other persons from the vicinity of the Judges while they are judging.
- 4 Stewards will not do or say anything to influence the Judge's decision. They must not reveal the name of the exhibitor or repeat any remarks the Judges may make to each other.
- 5 Stewards will obtain the Award book from the Judge, when filled in and signed, and deliver the same to the Secretary.
- 6 Stewards shall collect prize cards, ribbons etc. from the Secretary and affix to awarded exhibit after filling in the name and the particulars of the successful exhibit.
- 7 Pavilion Stewards will be in attendance at their respective pavilions from 10am to 11am Sunday 17 May to supervise the collection of exhibits and the handing out of prize money and trophies. All unclaimed prize money, trophies and exhibits are to be returned to the Secretary's Office immediately thereafter.
- 8 It is drawn from the Association Rule, that ALL Stewards shall withdraw while judging of exhibits, in which they have particular interest, directly or indirectly, is taking place.

Judges

- 1 Judges will report to the Secretary's Office on the Showground at the hour appointed and introduce themselves to the Secretary and Stewards of the relevant section.
- 2 Judges will receive an Award book from the Stewards of the Class.
- 3 Judges, as they arrive at their decision, will write their award with any remarks they may desire in the Award Book. They may mention three honours in case of a protest.
- 4 The Judges may recommend for a Certificate for any exhibit of special merit not included in the schedule.
- 5 Judges will sign the Award book and deliver it to the Stewards of the Class immediately after completion of Judging.
- 6 Judges will disqualify any exhibitors, which in their opinion, do not comply with the regulations and shall enter the reason in their Award book.
