### **Baking Hints:**

\* Use a tea-towel on your cake rack so your cakes don't get marked by the rack.

\* Icing should set hard and can be any colour. Suggest icing sugar, a small amount of butter and liquid.

\* Cakes should be iced on the top only, not the sides.

\* Patty cakes can be made in muffin papers.

\* Great marble cakes are made by alternating pink, chocolate and white cake mix on top of each other and around the tin.

\* Use dark coloured cocoa for chocolate cakes and chocolate crackles. Try to match the colour of your chocolate icing to the colour of your chocolate cake.

\* Judging will take into account the age appropriate skills of the baker.

\* Most of all be safe, have fun and help clean up when you are finished!


